Citizens on Patrol volunteers are provided training by AZ Post Certified Deputies, fully equipped patrol vehicles, office space and meeting facilities. Uniforms and equipment are provided through funds donated to the COP Program. Volunteers with Citizens on Patrol contribute approximately 13,000 volunteer hours per year and have saved taxpayers over \$1,000,000 in wage equivalency savings while patrolling communities to create a visual deterrent to crime under the leadership of Sheriff Paul Babeu and COP Program Director, Pat Prince.
